### **HEAR President's Report**

Once again, our Spring general membership meeting was a great success, highlighted by Mayor R.J. Berry's presentation. He spoke about the coming changes to I-25 and Paseo del Norte and highlighted his vision for ABQ, The Plan. Afterwards he took questions from those in attendance on topics ranging from recycling, to water conservation, and red light cameras. A nice representation of Heritage East Residents was there to show the Mayor that we are an active and engaged neighborhood association.

By now you will have noticed the new landscaping rock

installed in the parkway's along Ventura between San Francisco and Paseo del Norte. This is phase one of the upgrade being provided as part of Councilor Brad Winter's capital improvement budget. Phase 2, south of San Francisco, is expected to begin later this year. Thanks to Councilor Winter for appropriating this funding for our neighborhood after our request to him for this improvement.

Once again, the HEAR Board is looking for ways to improve our neighborhood with your dues. If you have any suggestions, please contact any board member. One of our next projects will be to repaint the wall at Ventura Estates, the southernmost portion of Heritage East. We also continue to hire local students to pick up weeds and litter twice a month all summer long and once a month in the winter.

HEAR is still providing nightly neighborhood security. We remain the only neighborhood association in Albuquerque to provide that service with voluntary dues. Last fall, we switched to weekday daytime patrols during the Christmas season. Heritage East is obviously not totally crime free, but we have one of the lowest crime rates in the city for any neighborhood of our size. Of course, the best possible deterrent to crime is to keep your eyes and ears on the street and watch out for your neighbor and vourself.

### New Blue Recycling Carts Arriving inJune

Our neighborhood has just begun receiving the new blue recycling carts. Clear recycle bags will no longer be distributed. A few pointers: Place your cart 5 ft. away from all obstructions including cars, poles, and additional carts. Don't load your cart with more than 100 pounds. The lid of your cart must close with ease. All approved items can be placed in the cart loosely; including cardboard (do not bag anything). As with the other refuse carts, they must be out at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on collection day. Acceptable items include: all white and colored writing paper, computer paper, magazines, newspapers including inserts, junk mail, corrugated cardboard, cereal/cracker boxes, books( hard or soft cover), paper egg cartons, soda boxes, milk cartons/juice boxes, phone books, food and pet cans, soda/beer cans, pots and pans, small metal appliances, plastic milk jugs, bleach bottles, plastics #1-#7 (crates, hampers, toys), all plastic bottles and jugs with a screw top lid or that have a neck smaller than the base, two liter bottles, cell phones, cameras, peripherals (keyboard, mouse, cables), and rechargeable batteries. Prohibited items: glass, hazardous waste, scrap metal such as metal pipe, hangers, wires, or automotive parts, hot ashes, concrete, rocks, gravel, or wood, pizza boxes, snack food bags (like chips or popcorn bags), fast food containers, cups or wrappers, styrofoam or styrofoam peanuts, plastic furniture, plastic grocery bags, plastic film, plastic wrap or dry cleaning bags, grass, leaves, plant trimmings, tree branches, computer monitors, and TV's. Summer is finally here and the Spring winds have been replaced by June sunshine and yard projects! Enjoy the great weather and stay safe!



### New Street Signs in the Neighborhood

Did you notice something different in the neighborhood? The HEAR board discussed the issue of street-name signs that were unreadable, bent, or missing. Some stop signs were faded and in need of replacement. We contacted the City by calling 311 and faxing a list of 30 different signs needing attention. Within one week the signs were replaced. The street name signs were replaced with the new larger-print signs. Did you notice? This neighborhood takes pride in being one of the nicer areas to live in Albuquerque. Please let the

### For The Birds

Summer is almost here and is even drier than last year. Many of the Winter birds such as the dark-eyed Juncos have moved up into the cooler mountains for the summer, and the latitudinal migrants are still moving north. Summer residents such as Bullock's Oriole, Lesser and American Goldfinches, and Green-tailed Towhee are back. Permanent residents such as House Finch, House Sparrow, Northern Flicker, Mourning, White-winged, and Eurasian Collared Doves, Western Scrub Jay, Bushtit, and Say's Phoebe, as well as Summer residents need places to nest. You can help them by providing suitable nesting habitat such as trees and shrubs, and further help them to succeed by putting out clothes dryer lint for nest lining, ground egg shells for calcium, and especially water.



For providing water I recommend using a large, shallow plant saucer (terra cotta), and placing a stone in the middle of it. That allows the birds a place to perch while drinking. By placing the dish on the ground, it can also be used by ground feeders such as doves and quail.

Don't forget the Hummingbirds, mostly Black-chinned. They come readily to sugar water feeders hung in the shade to slow down fermentation. A solution of one part sugar to 4 parts water is all that is needed. Don't use honey. It can cause a fungal growth in Hummingbird's throats. Also, don't use red dye in the water. Hummers can find the feeder on their own. Have a good summer and enjoy the birds in your yard.

### Weed Season is upon us!

Thank you to our volunteers that came out on Saturday April 27th, to rake, pick up debris, and help beautify Heritage East. Or, you may be a resident who cleaned up your own property that day - neighbors working together help keep our HEAR neighborhood clean and beautiful. Be ready for the weedy season. Our warmer temperatures result in growth of new vegetation, both wanted and unwanted. Please remember it is your responsibility as a homeowner to maintain your property in compliance with City of Albuquerque Weed and Litter Ordinance.

Weeds with a height or spread of more than (4) inches should be removed in the following areas:

Within the front, rear and/or side yards of your property.

Between your property line(s) and the curb.

The area(s) located ten feet outside your property line(s) if there is no curb (reference Section 9-8-4, ROA 1994).

Owners are responsible for keeping the area between the sidewalk and curb (parkway) free of weeds and debris. The City of Albuquerque does NOT maintain these areas. Property owners must keep their lots in neat and orderly conditions at all times.

Thank you for your support and cooperation in maintaining your property free from weeds and debris. Weeds have a deteriorating and negative impact on all our HEAR property values and quality of life considerations.


